

# LAHNI ALLEN: A WOMAN WHO WEARS MANY HATS



Life rarely goes as planned, but that unpredictability can lead to opportunity, and because I'm an animal person, every door that opens with the chance to work with animals has been a gift!

With a background in exercise science, education, and gerontology, I've had the chance to be part of a team that interacts with animals who motivate the best performances; console and listen quietly after the worst; bring comfort, love and smiles

to the most challenging of life's struggles; carry special needs kids to new heights and successes (on the backs of some amazing therapy horses); and who offer unconditional love every day—the best welcomes, lots of smiles and silly joyful moments that light up every corner of our lives!

Through my volunteer work, I've had the chance to give back—working as part of an animal-assisted therapy team at a local hospital, supporting local animal shelters, and working with Covenant Creatures, a local Olympia program that helps individuals and families facing food insecurity and homelessness, through education, vet care, and supplies for their beloved pets.

Through it all, my most enduring role has been as an educator/advocate for palliative care, making choices that lead to the best possible quality of life—and when that quality is no longer there, to love, comfort and care through the most peaceful, stress-free passing available. I work with people with Parkinson's disease, as an exercise and movement educator. For dogs, it began with a couple of abused dachshunds from a local dachshund rescue....



Somewhere in there Old Dog Haven appeared on the radar and it just made sense! About 10 years ago, our family began donating to ODH, sponsoring dogs, and regularly checking out the ODH website. We'd had experience caring for old, abused and special needs

dachshunds, so although we had our quota of dogs at home, we wanted to support this wonderful work.



In 2013 we adopted our first ODH dog—Dolly—a little, blind, double dapple dachshund, with boundless energy and a love of squeaky toys, and we also developed a wonderful friendship with Tina and Rick Nabseth, who had nursed Dolly into

adoptable form. Six months later, at Judith's urging, we added ODH dog Rudy, then Brownie and Crispie, Cecil, Heidi, and Molley. Some we fostered, working with Judith to ensure their best possible care, but mostly we are failed fosters: we chose to adopt the dogs outright, so that ODH could take on other dogs in need.

Five years ago, as an ODH volunteer I joined the transport team. I love 'springing' these dogs and sharing special rides with daughter Emily. Then, I added the 'thank-you' note team, assisted at some ODH info tables, and two years ago, became the person who handles the inquiries at ODH referrals—the wing of ODH where we list dogs on behalf of owners, and do our best to help them find wonderful forever homes for their dogs. I've also contributed to the educational materials for new ODH homes, and done dog evaluations.

ODH is such a wonderful collection of people who 'get it'. They recognize the plight faced by many old dogs in need and give of their time and finances, limit their travel, give up vacations, alter their social lives—in short, they do whatever is needed to provide the medical care needed, and the safe, comfortable, consistent, and loving homes that these dear old dogs deserve.

Our choice of special needs dogs has kept us on a three hour tether to home for the last 15 years. This type of commitment requires a 'village', and I am thankful to friends, and family—husband Greg, and daughters Ariel and Emily—for their commitment to these dogs and for their loving willingness to accept the many compromises made on their behalf.

It is a blessing to share our home and our love with these wonderful dogs, and such a joy to be part of the amazing transformation that occurs when they learn they can relax and depend on your love. As for the final goodbyes, it never really gets easier, but it is an invaluable gift to both the dogs and us to share joyously this last of life's journeys, together.

## **KUDOS TO VOLUNTEER MICHAEL RAFFANTI**



I owe my involvement with Old Dog Haven to a beautiful, grey-muzzled, black Labrador named Solomon. When I first became acquainted with ODH on Facebook, Final Refuge dog Solomon had become something of a poster boy for the organization. When I saw the opportunity to meet him in the flesh at a Northwest Cellars fundraiser for ODH, I couldn't resist. Making the trip to

Kirkland was well worth the drive from Tacoma. I fulfilled my wish of petting Solomon and other ODH dogs who I had admired on Facebook. I also purchased bottles of wine with Solomon's likeness on the label. Most significantly, I spoke with Tina Nabseth, who encouraged me to complete a volunteer application so that I could be called upon to transport dogs from the Tacoma Humane Society or other local shelters to their foster or Final Refuge homes elsewhere in the Puget Sound Region.

Accepting this call to volunteer has proved to be an incredibly rewarding experience. I have picked up dogs for transport who are deaf, blind, barely able to walk, or otherwise disabled or unwell. But I can always sense their happiness as they head outside and even more of a sense of freedom when they get in my car. I like to spend quality time with them while we are driving, offering treats and words of encouragement about how much they are going to enjoy their new home. Even though I spend just a little time with them, I always fall in love and am lonely on my return to Tacoma. If you are considering becoming a transport volunteer, I recommend it highly.

I have recently collaborated with friends in Washington and La Paz, Mexico, to form a nonprofit called Mila's Mutts. Our aim to is rescue dogs from Mexico, get them healthy, and find them homes in the Pacific Northwest. My own rescue dogs are from La Paz, so this effort is near and dear to my heart. My experiences with ODH informs my approach to dog rescue; that is, we will rescue all dogs who need our help, whether they are puppies or seniors. Of course, most dogs living on the streets don't make it to old age, but there are some who are dumped by their families when they become old or sick. In the spirit of Solomon and the ODH organization, we won't turn our backs on these animals.
