She's taken dogs into the emergency clinic for fosters who couldn't get out (LONG drive and time commitment), picked up dogs we took from owners—not an easy assignment—and in general nothing is too much trouble for her."

Tina Nabseth, our Placement Coordinator, also has this to say about Michele: "I cannot say enough good things about her. She's a generous and caring person. She's not only a foster, she's an Area Foster Coordinator. Michele will transport at the drop of the hat as well. She is always offering help. She has also represented ODH at events. Recently she's been helping me with our Facebook page, learning how to answer comments and PMs to our page. She has a microchip scanner, and here in Sultan and Monroe she scans dogs and cats when found, including those that are deceased. She also puts signs up for people with her own money for lost/found cats and dogs. Michele is wonderful."

We first learned of ODH in 2010 when we were looking to adopt a small, senior dog as a companion for our 17 year old husky mix. ODH had one listed on their website for adoption, and he seemed to be what we wanted. After bringing our little pom home we

decided we would like to try fostering senior dogs. And that was the beginning of our love affair with ODH and senior dogs.

Our first FR was a shih tzu who was blind, deaf, had terrible skin, and was way past just being a senior dog. He was only with us for a few months before we lost him. Since then we have had many ODH FR dogs—all small and with many different issues. Some were with us for years, others only a week or so. But we like to think we made a difference in their lives.

In fostering for ODH you have to have an open mind. These dogs are already old and have many of the ailments associated with older dogs, whether it be the feeding, medication, or having to help them up and down stairs.



But fostering the old dogs is the most important to us. We often sit and ask ourselves how did we end up with a houseful of dogs! The answer: we love animals, and they need us to love them, to give them the best life we can, and to keep them safe and as healthy as possible. We

currently have four ODH fosters and two resident dogs. We will keep doing this until our age won't let us do it anymore.

In our spare time Dan and I like to read and work crossword puzzles. Dan loves to cook (thank heavens, because I don't.) I used to write thank you cards, but arthritis in my hands put a stop to that. I also help at events, monitor donation jars and calendar sales at several locations.

### A MESSAGE FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF VETERINARY SERVICES JUDITH PIPER

This month we have particular wishes for our dog program: temporary or permanent foster homes who have no other dogs, AND can provide human company most if not all of the time.

We are sometimes asked by shelters to take dogs that might have kennel cough. Those possibly contagious dogs shouldn't go into a home with other old dogs that are at much greater risk of pneumonia developing if they catch a cold." A no-other-dogs home could also provide immediate vet care and learn a little about the dog's needs. If you can't make a lifetime commitment, but could help for two or three weeks and then send the dog on to a permanent foster home, we'd love to hear from you!

We would also LOVE to hear from you if you have no other dogs, but have humans around most of the time and are willing to be a permanent foster home. It's important to understand that the dogs coming to us have lost at least one home, often their only home, and usually have been in a very stressful shelter. Separation anxiety is very common, at least until they really understand that you'll be coming back and they won't be abandoned again. These dogs usually do better with dog company if you leave, but if there are humans around almost all the time—at least in the first month or two—often they relax and can be left for short periods. Until then you can expect barking, worry, or perhaps destructiveness if the dog is completely alone.

We know there aren't many homes that fit these descriptions—and who love old dogs enough to take in a neglected, smelly, worried, old creature often in pretty bad health—but if you're out there we really would like to hear from you! You will enjoy watching the dog change with care and love, and you'll be giving an old dog a very great gift. Read our website's "Being an ODH Home" page for details. Thank you!
