MEET FINAL REFUGE DOG RAVEN

Foster Laura Demory tells us about her Old Dog Haven (ODH) Final Refuge dog Raven:



"Raven ended up in the shelter when her owner had to go into care. When the Old Dog Haven transporters arrived with Raven, they brought out a crate with this little ball of fluff, all curled in on herself. It took several minutes for her to emerge from the crate.


"The resident dog, Poppy, a wonderfully calm and confident Lhasa mix, waited to greet Raven. We spent a few minutes outside in the yard before attempting to go in the house. I let her come in on her own terms, which took several minutes as well. Once off her leash, she dashed away and stayed out of reach for the next few days, but always nearby where she could keep an eye on me.

"Eventually Raven got brave enough to allow me to touch her – as long as I was sitting down and it was on her terms. She slowly got brave enough to jump up next to me on the couch, then on the bed, and finally, to let me pick her up. It turned out to be a good thing that her first grooming appointment came almost a month after I got her, so I was able to transport her for grooming. Once the fluff was removed, we discovered a toy poodle underneath! So adorable!

"Raven has continued to make progress and gain confidence. In the meantime, I lost Poppy, who was herself an old dog, and took in another ODH foster, Pepper. ODH thought his quiet, confident, and friendly personality would be a good fit, and of course, they were right.

"Today I have a constant companion who keeps a close eye on me and all the comings and goings around the house. Pepper has shown Raven that people don't have to be scary, and Raven is now willing to run up to new people and let them touch her, even if it means they have to bend over to do it. That is huge! She is a ferocious alert dog inside a tiny 7-pound body. Raven spends her time when I am out of the house keeping watch from the back of the couch, where I have begun to find my socks, magically transported from the dirty clothes bin.

"Raven is my first poodle, and has turned out to be a happy and delightful little dog. My heart is filled with so much joy and gratitude that I got to be Raven's person."

MEET FOSTER MEREDITH MOSES

ODH Final Refuge foster Meredith Moses shares her fostering journey with us:

"I have been fostering for Old Dog Haven (ODH) for about 13 years. I got started at a tough time in my life – lost my job, had to move, lost two dogs in rapid succession. Without a job I didn't think I could afford another dog – until I found out about the Final Refuge program. Even unemployed, I could budget for food and routine care – and then ODH covered the medical expenses.



So I got started with Alfie, a wirehaired something or other. Alfie was a godsend in a tough time. We

needed each other. After that there was no turning back. I currently have four – Jack Boudreau, Chuy Guillermo, Martha Anne and

Kevin Leonard.




"Over the years, I've been blessed with 24 fosters. Some only lasted a short time. Jeffery was with me for 6 weeks. Others quite a bit longer. Kizzy Louise ruled the roost in our home for over 5 years.

"Each one had their own unique personality. Leroy was a clown, Kizzy Louise was a diva. Reggie Garth Brooks was an eternal optimist. Marcia Jean loved children. Bridget Rose was just a little love bug. Martha Anne has opinions about everything. Jack Boudreau is my little mama's boy.

"They generally arrived depressed and confused, usually with significant physical issues. To watch them grow into their true selves is a gift beyond

compare. Zeke arrived with extreme physical issues, Chuy arrived heartbroken and depressed. And they blossomed.






There is always support from the ODH medical team as well as care and compassion from the extended family of staff and Final Refuge fosters.
