

## **MEET FINAL REFUGE DOGS MOCHA AND SELENA**



Julie: "Their first time on our nearby Lake - they weren't so crazy about it..."

At the ripe old age of fourteen, sisters **MOCHA** and **SELENA**, Chihuahua mixes, are living the good life with their foster **JULIE KERR**, who has lived up to her mantra of giving her foster dogs "a soft place to fall."

The two sisters are Julie's sixth and seventh ODH dogs and fill the void left after Julie's oldest and longest fostered dog, Jack, died last year at the astonishing age of 21.

Mocha and Selena couldn't have found a more experienced and welcoming

foster in every way than Julie, as before becoming an ODH foster, Julie was a foster to one hundred children!

Though a long way off from breaking into their

20s like their predecessor, Mocha and Selena have senior health issues: both have a heart condition and Mocha also has bronchitis. However, a few aches and pains here and there don't prevent them living life to the fullest, even if things are a little on the sedentary side these days.

"They're not so crazy about going outside," Julie admits. The solution is for them to see the world from the air-conditioned comfort of Julie's car as they accompany Julie on errands to friends' houses or the park, always watching the

world go by with intense focus.


"They both have quite different personalities," says Julie,

"Selena is more shy, reserved, a little bit timid even, which actually is her most endearing quality. It makes me want to try to let her know that much more that she is loved. She is such a sweet girl though and smiles sweetly and has a very expressive face. She's not very playful, but loses her mind when I come home - bouncing and racing around like a pup. Selena's favorite place to be is in one of her dog beds, but they both absolutely refuse to share a bed."

"This is my bed!" "Ditto."

"Mocha has a great personality. She's much more outgoing than Selena," says Julie, "but, unlike Selena, Mocha's face is nearly expressionless. Her most endearing quality is her attachment to me. She loves to be close to me or in my lap at all times. She follows me around the house and will find me or check in with me if I go to a different room and she doesn't notice. I find it cute that Mocha hops a little when I pick her up - it's as if she's helping me. Her favorite spot to be is on me or right next to me."

"Mocha takes a small dose of maintenance prednisone to control the coughing from her bronchitis. It makes her absolutely ravenous, and she loves dog treats like Selena. I've tried to deal with the weight gain, but I've not had much success. So, while Selena is very slight and dainty, Mocha is a solid little sausage, but they're both great characters, and I just love having them around. I hope there will be many more car rides and cuddles to come."

Aaron admits that he used to be a very shy person when it came to speaking in public, but he and the other volunteers are so passionate about the fostering they have done that they love to share their experience with others.



Aaron and the events team stay especially busy over the summer months representing Old Dog Haven at many events in various locations and are currently gearing up for one of our largest events of the year, Old Dog Haven's Summer Splash on August 5th in Shoreline. One of the challenges Aaron faces in his job is finding enough volunteers to help staff extra events. He says, "Our presence is often requested at venues, but we don't have enough volunteers to staff every request."

The community support Old Dog Haven receives allows us to continue to care for old dogs who need and deserve safe, loving homes at the end of their lives.

#### MEET FOSTER MOTHER AND DAUGHTER JENNIFER AND STEPHANIE

ODH Final Refuge Fosters Jennifer Schlenker and daughter Stephanie Conrad share their fostering journey. As told by Stephanie:

I've been a foster for six years and my mom has been a foster for five. My mom and have always loved dachshunds, my mom had dachshunds growing up, and she continued the tradition while I was growing up, passing the love for them on to me.

In fact, it was shortly after a dachshund of mine died six years ago that I first became an ODH foster. I saw an ODH Facebook post for a senior dachshund, Brandy, and I knew I had to be her foster.

After helping me with Brandy, my mom got the bug and became a foster too just a year later, so she's been a foster five years now. Since we started fostering we've both had three ODH dogs each - and all of them have been dachshunds, of course!

Right now, we have Wolfie and Charlie. They've gotten along with each other since day one. They're best buddies. When Wolfie does zoomies, Charlie will follow suit.

Wolfie is the darker colored one with long hair. He has dental problems and missing teeth and an oranasal fistula. He lives with my mom and her other non-ODH dog, Joy. Wolfie's favorite thing is to hop around when he wants to play – be it with Charlie, Joy or my mom and I. Wolfie loves being petted, he's such a sweetheart, and will come straight to me for a petting if my mom is busy.

Charlie is a lighter red, short haired with one brown eye and one blue eye, and he lives with me. I've had him three years now. His owner had gone to hospital and sadly knew she wasn't coming back out. She didn't want him stuck in a shelter, so that's how he ended up with ODH, and then with me. He's not always super affectionate with everyone else, but he's very attached to me. He's very smart, and definitely very active - twirling in circles for snacks and walks, and his walking style is to prance like a pony. He also has a great sense of smell and really enjoys our game of finding hidden treats.

When I'm at work, my mom watches Charlie, which is perfect because Charlie loves to see Wolfie and his buddy, Joy. We don't find it too difficult to look after our ODH dogs, because we don't go out of town on vacation, and if we go to the store, then the dogs keep each other company.

I'd say the skills you need as a foster are compassion, time, love and it helps to have some knowledge of senior dogs. At the end of their lives, the goodbye is hard, but it's still satisfying because you're giving the dog a wonderful last chapter.
